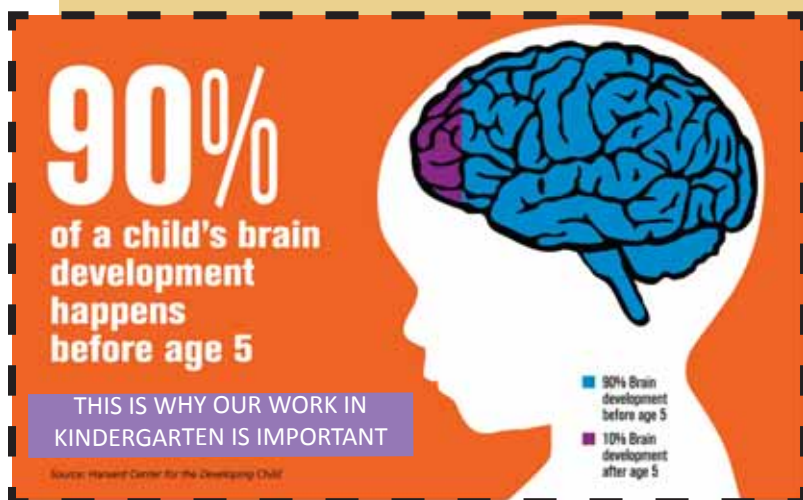

OUR PATHWAY TO SCHOOL PROGRAM

Play is a fundamental right for every child* and integral to experiencing the joy of childhood. Early learning experts specify that 'Play is fundamental to children's learning in the early years and is the way in which children organise and make sense of the world around them as they interact with people, the environment, community and each other.' In the first five years, children's brains develop at a rate faster than any other time in the life span. For this reason, they need freedom to test their limits, discover new things, communicate, interact with others, build resilience to fail and bounce back, and solve problems. It is through high quality play-based learning that neural pathways are developed as the foundation for life-long learning.



QUEENSLAND KINDERGARTEN LEARNING GUIDELINE (QKLG)

All of our **university-qualified early childhood teachers** create and implement a stimulating play-based curriculum that is tailored to support each child's development, aligned with the QKLG.

This guiding document outlines 5 key areas for children's learning and development:

- Identity
- Connectedness
- Wellbeing
- Active learning
- Communication

PATHWAY TO SCHOOL PROGRAM

Children engage in an active learning process through relationship with teachers, the local community, other children, and exploring items in the learning space. These opportunities allow children to wonder, discover, develop their independence, and lays the foundation of literacy and numeracy skills. Our kindergarten day is a blend of small and whole group experiences, both indoors and outdoors related to the following curriculum areas:

- Science and technology
- Literacy and numeracy
- Creative arts and construction
- Music and dramatic play
- Physical, adventurous play
- Nature play
- People and places
- Wellbeing and lifeskills

We will continue to share your child's learning progress with you and provide regular updates about the program through our digital platform.



PATHWAY TO SCHOOL

Our Pathways to School approach is based on inquiry learning approach developing 21st century skills. This includes getting along and working with others, bouncing back from disappointment, understanding the importance of being physically healthy and mentally fit. As part of the program children will become mathematical thinkers and confident storytellers and writers.



EXTRA-CURRICULAR EVENTS

Throughout the year, children enrich their learning and build stronger connections with our local and wider community by participating in excursions. Teachers will also invite special visitors to the service to support connections in the community and link with the learning in the kindergarten.

These extra-curricular events are valuable opportunities for children to explore and learn from their community.

Families are warmly invited to participate in these events and support children's learning.

These extra-curricular events are different for every service as they are responsive to the broader service community and link to children's interests and program focus areas during the year.

There is no additional cost for these experiences.

PATHWAYS TO SCHOOL

The kindergarten program equips children with the skills needed for their important transition to school and onward learning journeys. Our kindergarten program supports your child to be school-ready.

Starting school is an exciting step for your child and your family! We look forward to working in partnership with you to:

- Set goals for your child enabling them to be a successful learner.
- Provide a meaningful curriculum supporting your child's interests.
- Create a positive transition to school.
- Help your child to become confident about this change by linking with local schools and Prep teachers.
- Provide your family with information about the transition to school.

The kindergarten teacher will:

- Regularly discuss your child's learning progress with you throughout the year.
- Prepare your child's Transition to School Statement.
- Encourage you to contribute to this statement .
- Share the statement with your child's Prep teacher to help them understand your child's strengths and interests.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What fees are payable to attend the kindergarten program?

The amount families can expect to pay will vary. Child Care Subsidy will cover a portion of the cost of a Kindergarten program, with a gap fee payable by families. Government funding helps to keep fees as low as possible, and the funding is provided directly to kindergarten services. The QLD Government 'Free Kindy' offering is applied to all eligible children for 40 weeks per year. There are subsidies available to help families with the cost of early childhood education. Please speak with your Service Manager about fees and subsidies.

What are the hours of the kindergarten program?

Our Kindergarten program is available for 5 days per week, ensuring each child receives a minimum of 15 hours funded kindergarten each week. You can take advantage of the longer opening hours each day for greater access to the kindergarten program. Your specific service will advise you of the kindergarten hours each day.

Do all early childhood teachers have the same qualification?

All teachers delivering a kindergarten program in Queensland are required to:

- Have a government approved bachelor's degree qualification in early childhood education.
- Are often registered with the Queensland College for Teachers

What other support can my child access for their learning?

Please talk with your child's teacher about any special requirements needed to support your child's inclusion, and about any external support agencies your family is connected to. The service is able to access additional support to ensure each child's full participation in the preschool program.
